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PUBLISHED CDC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PREVENTING TRANSMISSION OF HIV AND HEPATITIS B VIRUS TO PATIENTS DURING EXPOSURE-PRONE INVASIVE PROCEDURES INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

1. All healthcare workers (HCW—including medical students) should adhere to universal precautions.
2. HCW who have exudative lesions or weeping dermatitis should refrain from all direct patient care and from handling patient-care equipment and devices until the condition resolves.
3. HCW who perform exposure-prone procedures should know their HIV antibody status.
4. HCW who are infected with HIV or HBV (and are HbeAg positive) should not perform exposure-prone procedures unless they have sought counsel from an expert review panel and been advised under what circumstances, if any, they may continue to perform these procedures.
5. HCW should notify prospective patients of the HCW's seropositivity before they undergo exposure-prone invasive procedures.
