General Information


Intended Audience

Physicians, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses, nurses, surgical technologists, radiologic technologists, social workers, psychologists, occupational and physical therapists, certified medical dosimetrists, certified tumor registrars, and medical office staff in all specialties.

Program Overview

The sole objective of this symposium is to educate all physicians and healthcare personnel regarding the current diagnosis, staging, and treatment of breast cancer in a comprehensive, multidisciplinary fashion.

Through this CME activity, the participant should better understand theories and facts related to the development of breast cancer, current imaging and diagnostic modalities, surgical treatment, adjuvant therapies of chemotherapy and radiation, breast reconstruction, and managing patients with breast cancer. This activity will also educate the participants about breast cancer from a multidisciplinary approach. This symposium hopes to help physicians and healthcare personnel reach a better understanding related to all aspects of breast cancer and how we all may contribute to help individuals overcome this disease while maximizing quality of life.



Educational Objectives

- Discuss cancer metastasis and identify some of the molecules involved.
- Discuss the opportunities for targeting metastasis as a therapeutic target.
- Recognize possible background genetic contributions to metastasis predilection.
- Explain the Metastatic Breast Cancer Project to patients.
 Assess patient eligibility for the project.
- Differentiate immunotherapy- based treatment from traditional treatments for breast cancer.
- List some value-based payment models in radiology.
- Measure the potential risks of screening the 40-49 year old.
- Describe clinical validation studies and indications for ultrasound elastography of the breast.
- Explain the rationale for incorporating tumor biology in breast cancer staging.
- Summarize aspects of Version 8 that makes it more predictive of diagnosis.
- Cite how the navigator role can improve patient and physician satisfaction.
- Summarize the long-term cardiac effects of chemotherapy and radiation therapy.
- Discuss how burnout, depression and anxiety can lead to suicide amongst healthcare providers.
- Indicate how empathy decline can impact clinical outcomes.
- Summarize the importance of a multidisciplinary approach to breast cancer treatment.
- Integrate resources available to alleviate financial distress during cancer treatment.
- Describe the cosmetic advantages and disadvantages of pre-pectoral breast reconstruction.
- Describe the potential benefit of anti-androgen treatment in triple negative breast cancer.
- Apply oncoplastic techniques to aid in successful breast radiation.
- Incorporate how successful treatment effects long-term outlook.
- Explain how to preserve fertility while successfully treating young women.
- Differentiate special types of breast cancer from classic invasive lobular and invasive lobular carcinoma.
- Summarize how the pathology of special types of breast cancer may affect treatment decisions.
